

The Statute of Child and Adolescent

Law # 8.069 – June, 1990 Rules regarding the children's and adolescent's integral protection Purpose: to guarantee a healthy development with freedom and dignity

Fundamental Rights:

- · The right to life and health
- · The right to freedom, respect and dignity
- The right to live with the family and community
- The right to education, culture, sports and recreation
- The right to professional training and work



The law governs also the care of the juvenile offenders – those who commit infractions between 12 and 18 years old.

So, when an adolescent commits a crime, he or she is arrested by the police and taken to a public facility where are located the Justice, Police and Social Departments. The investigation about the crime and the adolescent's history will be studied during this temporary internment that can last for a maximum of 45 days.

But most of the adolescents are released on less than 24 hours. During that time they stay in cells although they have educational activities and interviews with the social workers and psychologists. They have also medical care and family visits. At the end they will have an audience with the judge, who will decide the sentence.

This process differs from the adult criminal, because above 18 years old the person must spend a defined time in prison and the adolescent must obey a socioeducational measure, that have no time definition, but it can reach the maximum of 3 years.

This measure implicates in liberty privation and the facilities have all the structure necessary to guarantee the adolescents security and confinement. They can stay for 3 years the maximum. They may be between 12 and 21 years old and must be separated in-groups by age, size and crime seriousness.

Those institutions must offer an educational program, including formal education and vocational training.




